## SPECIAL MEETING FOR ROOF REPAIR JUNE 16 at 10:30 am FORUMS and FINANCIAL APPEAL

A Special Congregation Meeting, Sunday June 16, 10:30 am will ask to:

- Authorize an expenditure of up to \$275,000 for the fellowship hall roof repair and air conditioning.
- Authorize an appeal for \$230,000 to cover expenses for roof repair and air conditioning.
- Approve LCDR taking a construction loan for up to \$230,000 as needed for roof repair and air conditioning.

#### Two Congregation Forums

Sundays, May 26 and June 9, 10:30 am (after worship) to offer updates to the project and receive congregation input.

#### Roof Project Financial Appeal

The appeal to raise funds for this project, once approved, will begin in late June with hopes of generating funds needed to pay for the project in 2024.

#### From the Senior Pastor:

Dear members of the Lutheran Church of Dell Rapids:

After careful work by our Property Committee and Council, we are now able to ask the congregation for authorization to expend funds, conduct a financial appeal and take a construction loan — all needed to complete our fellowship hall roof repair and HVAC project in 2024. A special meeting has been called for 10:30 am, Sunday, June 16 for congregational approval of these actions. Forums will be held on Sundays, May 26 and June 9, 10:30 am to offer updates to the project, and receive congregation input.

I don't think we are surprised that the project will cost considerably more, at \$275,000, than the original estimate of \$130,000.

As will be explained, most of this increase can be attributed to following the recommendation of engineers we employed to assess our building, that the fellowship hall's roof structure was not built to sustain the weight of the rock ballast currently used to hold down the roof fabric – and it should not be used again when the roof is redone. Instead of rock holding the new fabric in place, it will be a multi-layer glued-down fabric – a better roof, and more expensive.

The current air conditioning units that come down through the middle of the roof will be replaced by units that sit on the east side of the roof, with the condensers and HVAC moved to inside the building.

Engineers have also reported that the texture in the fellowship hall ceiling contains asbestos. Since there is no harm with it if not disturbed, we are planning at this point to complete the HVAC replacement without doing so.

Your leaders have worked with due diligence to insure that when we do this much needed repair work - we do it right, and we do it well. When completed, we will have prevented further damage from leaking water, replaced our dysfunctional AC units with a modern system, and replaced the roof with the kind and weight of materials that it was designed to support.

Please join your leaders for the scheduled forums to learn more about the scope and cost of this project and to offer your input. Please attend the special congregation meeting on June 16th to give the project your approval.

If approved, a roof project financial appeal asking for your support will begin soon. We're hopeful that this much needed repair of our wonderful facilities will be completed in time for our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration this fall!

#### From the Associate in Ministry:

Dear friends at LCDR, I am entering territory where I have no specific experience, but I do have some background to draw upon...and I have learned how to use and access the resources that are out there. Everywhere we turn, throughout the generations, we are hearing alarm bells go off about mental health: among our elders, adults of all ages, and increasingly, teens and kids.

We are the church. In our Bible Study this month from our Gather magazine, written by and for women of the ELCA, we are told that congregations can play a role in mental health ministry. We can be compassionate companions who learn how to give and receive mental health support. What many folks need is a loving presence, understanding and acceptance, along with links to professionals who can give necessary help.

This sounds a lot like the *GriefShare* model that is already working so well here. We bring people together who are going through a similar life experience, connect them to each other and to experts in the field who share both resources and tools to help navigate a difficult time. There are models of congregations who are doing just that for families and individuals who are struggling with mental health issues. We are not counselors or therapists, but we are caring, concerned friends who can love, listen, and lead to help.

I keep thinking about the parable of the paralytic whose friends carried him on a stretcher and lowered him through the ceiling to get him to Jesus. It reminds me of a book I read long ago, Stretcher Bearers, by Michael Slater. We actually used it for a teaching series "How to give and receive the gift of encouragement and support."

According to the author of our Bible study, Pastor Elise Seyfried, a good first step is to form an exploratory task force, a mental health ministry team, sort of, made up of people from several generations. Today's teens are well aware of mental illness within their age group, as are our elders aware of mental illness and challenges among seniors.

I am sharing these musings with all of you to seek your input... encouraging or not! It will be a process to get to the point of actually offering support, but I believe we are in the right place at the right time to at least try. If you are interested in helping, or if you have experience to share, please do reach out to me. I am ...



#### LUTHERAN CHURCH OF DELL RAPIDS CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MAY 15, 2024 (abbreviated)

<u>Call to Order</u>: President Shanna called the meeting to order at 7pm. <u>Opening Devotions</u>: Pat led devotions on the subject of Pentecost, what it means, and how it used to be the biggest event of the church year.

<u>Adoption of Agenda</u>: One addition was proposed under new business regarding the church website.

<u>Consent Agenda</u>: All reports have previously been made available to members. Consent agenda (committee reports and April minutes) approved.

Committee Reports: **Fellowship/Community Outreach** - Our April 14th spring fling was wonderful. The talent show was amazing! The putting contest ended with one person winning an Amazon gift card, and our bake off top 3 winners won a gift card to the County Fair. We look forward to our fall festival!

**Property -** The condensation pumps on the heating/AC units in the chapel were not working properly and that was repaired. The large plant in the back of the sanctuary was removed. The northeast door to the hallway needed a repair which has been done. The boiler will be shut down as we switch from heating to cooling. The lawn irrigation system will be set up for summer. This committee held a meeting on April 28 to review roofing bids.

**Stewardship** - This committee plans to have a meeting in May to prepare for the roof repair appeal campaign. LCDR is scheduled to help with Laundry with Love on July 23.

**Worship** - Praise Band will perform on May 12 and then will take a break until this fall. The Sunday School kids made doves for the 150th anniversary and they have been hung in the back of the sanctuary. They will remain on display until the anniversary service in September. Old time worship on May 19 and the 150th anniversary banner will be dedicated. There will be activities for the kids and we will start to fill the time capsule.

Youth/Family Ministry - There are 25 youth signed up for confirmation camp. The fleece blankets for our Seniors were completed and presented. The baskets and bidding was a success raising over a thousand dollars. John and our youth were involved in a DRHS event to pack food boxes for Feeding South Dakota.

Member Actions: None at this time.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Expenses exceeded thank-offerings in April. Motion carried to approve report.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jeff (present via telephone) stated that the Baccalaureate service went well. It felt really good as he has been working with these students since fifth grade. It is expected to have 25 students going to confirmation camp. That includes a few Non - members. Pat reported that she and Roe are selling their house and moving to a loft in Sioux Falls. The grief share group is continuing to go very well.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

150th Anniversary Task Force - The group met on May 14. The main focus was the old fashioned worship and picnic to be held Sunday May 19 in the chapel. The anniversary banners are already hanging in the chapel. The time capsule will be started after the service. Families will be able to add (non perishable) items to the time capsule through September/October. At that time, it will be sealed to be opened in 25 years. Work is progressing on the September event. Ticket costs will be around \$20 for adults and \$10 for kids. Whether or

not to have alcohol (wine) at the event is under discussion. A quilt raffle is planned with a quilt from our quilting group. There will be a memento item for all who attend the old fashioned worship service. Arrielle is updating the website.

Fellowship Hall Roof Updates - Steve reported that three bids have been received. Each bid addressed three different options. Two of the options included a rock ballast. An engineer came out and looked at the beams and trusses. We now know that our roof is not designed to hold a rock ballast. The ceiling in the fellowship hall does contain asbestos which most buildings built in the 1960's (when ours was done) do have. However it is not a health issue unless or until the ceiling is disturbed by cutting holes, drilling, etc. The Department of Agriculture has a program with grants for removing asbestos. However, their money is allocated through this year and we would have to apply for it to try and get a grant in 2025 or later. Bob indicated we can make it a two phase project which will address the roof repair and HVAC units first. We could deal with the ceiling and lighting later (if needed).

Roof Repair Appeal - The members discussed what needs to be done to set things in motion to start the appeal. We will get an informational mailing sent out and have at least one forum prior to the meeting. Motion made to hold a special congregational meeting on June 16 at 10:30 a.m.; Motion carried. Motion to authorize an expenditure of up to \$275,000.00 for roof repair and air conditioning; Motion carried. Motion made to authorize an appeal for \$230,000.00 to cover expenses for roof repair and air conditioning; Motion carried. Motion made to approve a construction loan for up to \$230,000.00 as needed for roof repair and air conditioning; Motion carried. Motion made to hold

informational forums on May 26 at 10:30 a.m. and on June 9 at 10:30 a.m.; Motion Carried. Steve will be present on the 26th and Scott will be present on the 9th to help answer questions. New Business:

Advertise Custodian Position - Arrielle's husband, Austin Scheibler has agreed to take on the custodial duties for the interim but he is not interested in the job on a permanent basis. Council went into executive session at 9:09 p.m. Council left the executive session at 9:21 p.m. Approved to advertise the custodian position until June 10.

**Synod Assembly** - May 31 to June 1 - Karen and Allen and Gloria Brown will attend the synod assembly.

Church website - Arrielle has requested to have a different webpage host. The one we currently have is quite old and greatly limits what can be done with the website. A new host could be had at a price of \$20 a month with WIX or possibly Direct Technology which may be free. It was decided to explore the options further before making a decision.

Announcements: Next meeting June 19 at 7:00 p.m.

Committee reports are due by noon on Monday June 17

Adjournment: Meeting adjourned at 9:27 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.


